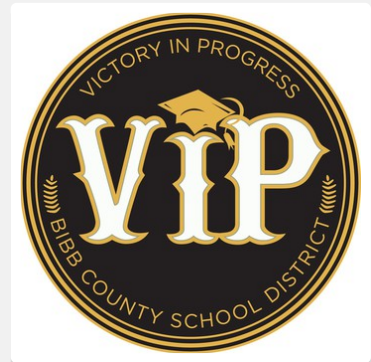

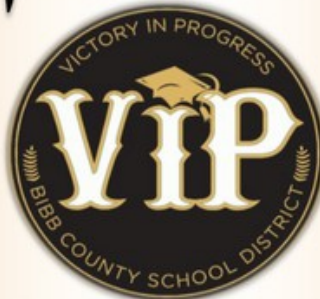

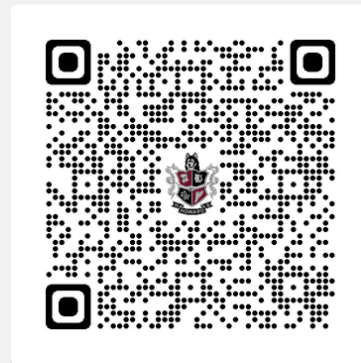

#### OVERVIEW:

The Douglass Theatre's Historically Black College & University (HBCU) Arts Series highlights the creative and imaginative excellence of HBCU students and alumni. The HBCU Arts Series Student Scholarship was started to further fulfill the Douglass Theatre's goal of being a valuable resource for the community. The scholarship is intended to help (HBCU bound) graduating high school seniors across Central Georgia to defray college expenses.

#### AWARD AMOUNT & APPLICATION PERIOD:

The maximum award amount is \$5,000 and based on funds available. The deadline for the application is on or before **April 1st** of each year. **Completed applications may be submitted electronically via email or mailed via U.S. mail to the address above. Applications submitted via email or postmarked after the deadline date will not be considered.**

#### ELIGIBILITY:

The opportunity to apply is open to students who meet the eligibility criteria listed below.

The HBCU Arts Series Student Scholarship is a **one-time award** and applicant **must** meet all criteria at the time of applying:

- Must be a **High School Senior** who has been officially accepted to and will be attending an accredited two or four-year Historical Black College & University (HBCU) during the fall term following graduation. The applicant must be able to provide proof of a copy of acceptance letter to an accredited HBCU.
- Must have a minimum 2.7 GPA.
- Applicants are encouraged to provide a web link or submit a photo collage or a short video of a creative performance/project that he/she has participated in (visual arts/photography, chorus/band, dancing, singing, etc).

#### APPLICATION PROCESS:

Complete and submit application form (via email or U.S. mail listed above):

- Include two (2) reference letters from teachers/professors/counselors/employers
- Include high school transcript (unofficial acceptable) or letter (certified by graduation coach/counselor)
- Include copy of acceptance letter to an accredited HBCU
- Include a one-page essay (250-300 words) on one (1) of the following topics:
  - o How do you see art by African Americans impacting society?
  - o Historically, African American Artists have impacted social justice movements, such as the Progressive Era, the Civil Rights Movement and Black Power Movement. How do you think Art by African Americans impacts social justice movements today? Choose a current artist and describe their impact.
  - o Have you recently attended any events at the Douglass or another theater? Describe the event and how it influenced your artistic expression.
  - o Write an artist statement. Share how the Douglass Theater HBCU Arts Series Scholarship will contribute to your development. (This question is inspired by the others).
  - o The Harlem Renaissance was an era in which African American Artists flourished. Choose an artist of any discipline from the era and describe how their work influences your own.

## The Georgia District Civitan Foundation Scholarship Opportunities

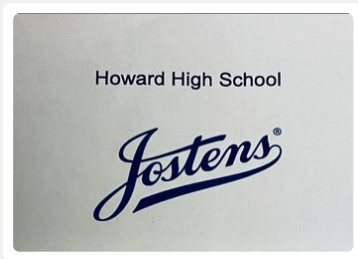

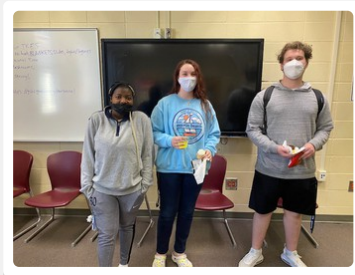
## CONGRATULATIONS TO THE CLASS OF 2022 HONOR GRADUATES

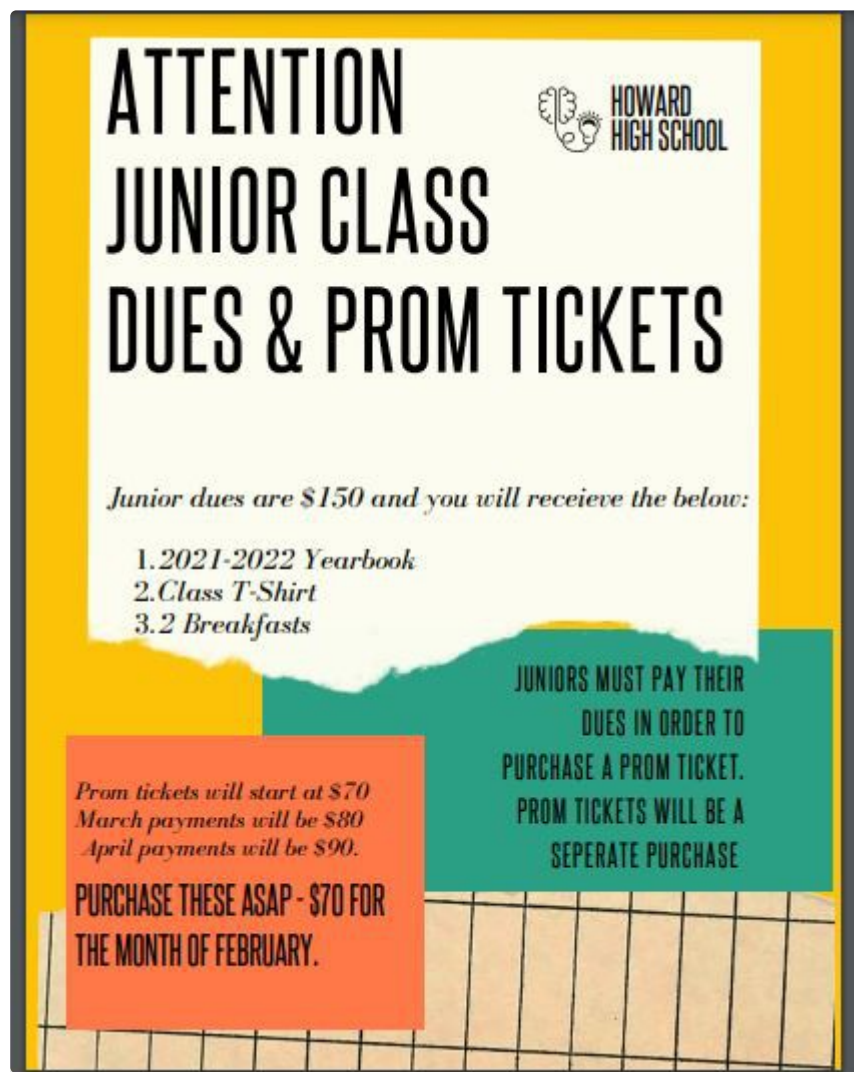

## LITERACY CORNER

### BLACK HISTORY MONTH - LITTLE KNOWN FACTS

Irene Morgan: Virginia's Freedom Fighter

On July 16, 1944, Morgan was on her way back to Maryland for a doctor's appointment. She bought a "colored" ticket for a Greyhound bus and after boarding, she headed to the "Colored" section in the back. About 45 minutes into the trip, a White couple boarded the bus, and the bus driver came to the back and told Morgan and the woman sitting next to her to move so that the White couple had a seat. After Morgan refused to give up her seat, the bus driver drove to the next town to have Morgan arrested. When they arrived, Morgan got an arrest warrant from a White officer, which she tore up in his face, and kicked him after he attempted to remove her from the bus with force. Eventually, multiple officers came on and removed her, and she was arrested in Saluda, Virginia. The police officers charged Morgan with violating Virginia's Jim Crow transit laws and resisting arrest. The case was taken to Virginia's Supreme Court, and she pled guilty and paid a \$10 fine for her charge of resisting arrest, but she refused to plead guilty for her second charge, violating Virginia's Jim Crow transit laws. In court, Morgan was represented by William H. Hastie and Thurgood Marshall. Unfortunately, she lost this case, so she decided to take it to the Supreme Court. On June 3, 1946, they decided Virginia should not have enforced their state laws on interstate buses. The Supreme Court's ruling made it so that segregation laws were not to be enforced on interstate public transportation.

## PARTNERS IN READING Reading Strategy

### Partners in Reading

This strategy is designed for students to work together and learn by previewing, reading, and summarizing a text. Students also have an opportunity to write a response to the reading relating it to their own lives.

#### Procedure:

Pair students and give a copy of the worksheet "Partners in Reading."

Partners preview text and write a prediction about what they might learn from it.

Partners look at visuals and each choose a visual he/she wants to know more about.

Partners read the text.

Partner 1 writes a summary of text and Partner 2 writes one or two questions about the text.

Each partner writes a short reflection about the reading. Feelings and opinions may be included in the reflection.

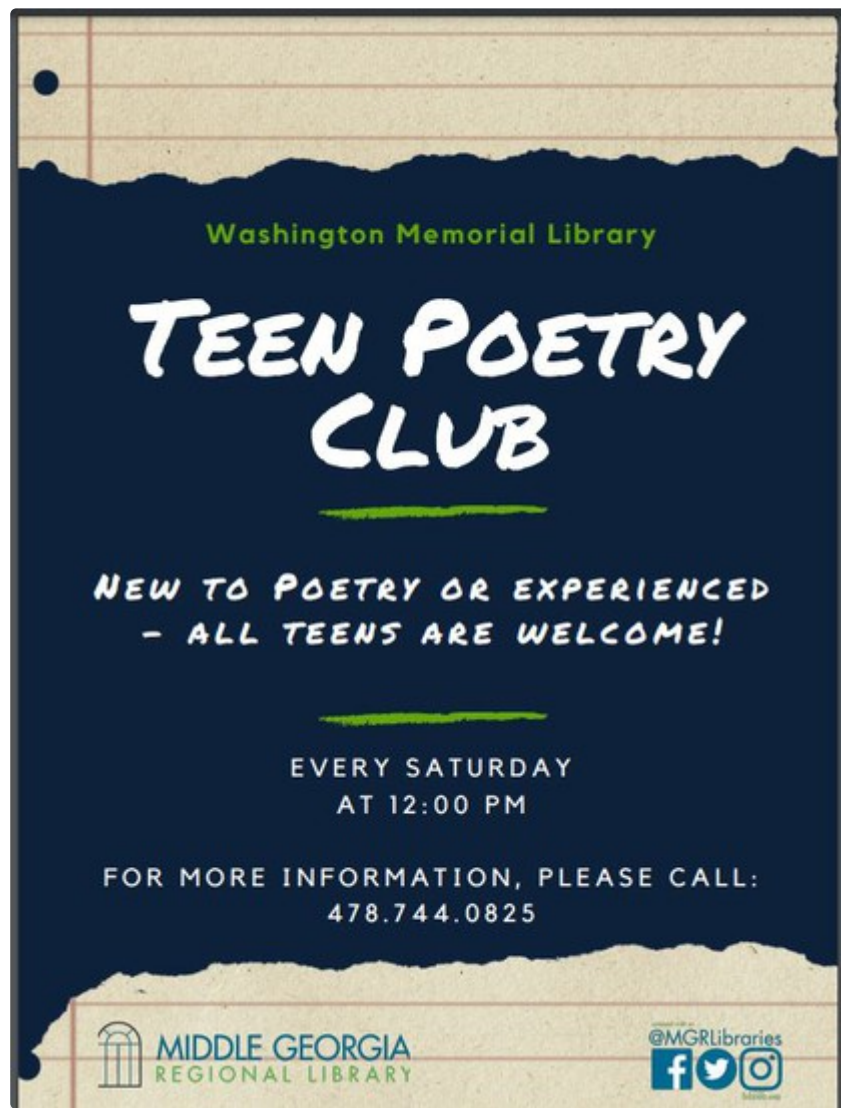

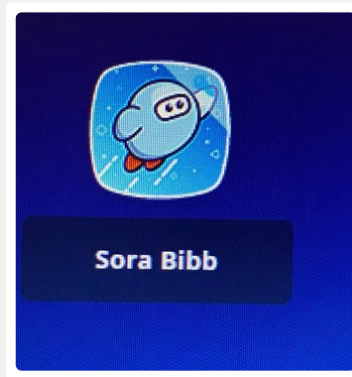
