

(MACON, GA) – Data released today by the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) show the Bibb County School District's high school graduation rate has surpassed 80 percent for the first time in at least a decade. The District's overall graduation rate for 2021 was 80.67 percent. This is up from an overall District graduation rate of 51.30 percent in 2011. All six high schools demonstrated growth in the graduation rate from 2020 to 2021, and both Central (pictured above) and Howard High Schools achieved a graduation rate of 85 percent for 2021 – a new high for District schools.



What is Tardy?

What Can You Do to Help?

 - Set a regular bedtime schedule and morning routine.
 - Prepare clothes and book bags at night.

COUNSELORS CORNER

The annual PROBE College Fair is coming up on Wednesday, November 10th. It will be held at Middle Georgia State University in the Volleyball Gym from 6:00-8:00 pm. This is an excellent opportunity for all 9th-11th grade students to begin the college search process, as many colleges and universities will be present to speak with students and parents and to hand out information. ATTENDANCE RECOVERY

Students - do you have more than 5 unexcused absences in one or more of your class periods? Remember that a total of 6 or more unexcused absences in a class period results in you receiving a failing grade of 69 in that class at the end of the semester, and therefore not earning credit for the course. Attendance Recovery is currently running each week, Monday-Thursday from 2:40 pm to 4:15 pm in Room 124. For each afternoon you attend, 2 unexcused absences (2 class periods, NOT 2 full days) will be removed. You must attend in person; there is no option to complete Attendance Recovery virtually. Make sure you bring homework/study materials to work on during the time you attend. Don't wait until the last minute - unexcused absences must be recovered no later than the end of the following month (example: absences earned in October MUST be made up by the end of November).

NURSE'S CORNER

HUSKY HEALTHY HABITS

- · Start with a Healthy Breakfast. A good breakfast will provide you energy needed during class. Be warned, foods high in sugar will leave you feeling tired soon after eating. Your performance at school is directly related to what you eat!
- · Hydrate! Water is the best fluid to keep you hydrated without the addition of sugar found in most juice and soft drinks.
- · Wash Your Hands. Scrub with warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds. Always wash your hands after you sneeze, cough or blow your nose; before you eat or fix food; hands visibly dirty; and after you use the restroom.
- · Boost your immune system. Get plenty of sleep. A good night's sleep can help improve your mood and health. Go to bed early and aim for 6-8 hours of sleep a night.
- · Eat for the Health of it! Eating plenty of fruits, vegetables and whole grains can reduce your risk of cancer and other chronic illnesses.
- · Move your body. Try for 30 to 60 minutes of moderate physical activity 4 to 5 times a week. Being active boosts your mood and fitness.
- · Keep stress in check. Too much stress can hurt your health. Regular exercise, talking things over with family or friends, and setting limits can help reduce stress levels.
- · Keep safety in mind. Take time to learn ways to stay safe at school, work, home and play. For example, wear your seatbelt and protect your skin from the sun.
- · Stay tobacco and alcohol free. Tobacco and alcohol have been linked to serious health problems such as lung, heart and liver disease, cancer and stroke.
