



COUNSELORS CORNER



Here are Some Tips for Taking Care of Yourself During the Holiday Season!

- Practice self-care daily. This means doing things like staying hydrated, getting enough sleep, and eating healthy meals.
- Make time for yourself each day. ...
- Don't compare yourself to others or compare what you have with what others have (positively or negatively).
- Be sure to take breaks from social media so that you don't get overwhelmed by what everyone else is doing during the holidays.

NURSE'S CORNER

IS YOUR CHILD TOO SICK?

It can be hard to decide whether or not your child is too sick to go to school. You should keep your child home if he/she might spread a contagious disease to other children or if he/she is too sick to get through the school day. Children who are sick have a hard time learning and may get other children sick.

If your child has any of the following, he/she should be kept home from school:

1. Fever over 100 degrees. Keep child home until temperature is normal for 24 hours without Tylenol or Ibuprofen (Motrin or Advil).
2. Vomiting or diarrhea. Keep child home until he/she has no vomiting or diarrhea for at least 24 hours.
3. Frequent cough or thick, runny nose that is not clear. Keep child home until symptoms have disappeared or significantly decreased.
4. If your child has a sore throat and fever, or a severe sore throat without fever.
5. If your child is prescribed an antibiotic, please keep home until he/she has been on the antibiotic for 24 hours and is without fever for 24 hours without Tylenol or Ibuprofen (Motrin or Advil).
6. If your child is unusually irritable or shows unusual behavior, we will contact you and may request that you pick up your child from school.
7. If your child has impetigo, or other sores that are oozing or bleeding, he/she should stay home until the sores have dried up and are scabbed over. If the sores can be covered with a bandage bigger than a regular band-aid, he/she may attend school with school nurse or principal approval.
8. Pink Eye. If your child's eye is red with cloudy or yellow drainage, he/she should stay home until symptoms are gone.

9. A cough that is worse than you would expect with a cold, especially if it keeps him/her awake at night, or if he/she is having a hard time breathing.






GRADE 10

SOPHOMORE YEAR: PLAN

- » If you are being actively recruited by an NCAA school and have a Profile Page account, **transition** it to the right **Certification** account.
- » Monitor the **task list** in your NCAA Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- » At the end of the school year, ask your high school counselor from each school you have attended to upload an official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.
- » If you fall behind academically, ask your high school counselor for help finding **approved courses** you can take.



GRADE 11

JUNIOR YEAR: STUDY

- » Ensure your **sports participation** information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- » Check with your high school counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved **core courses** and graduate on time with your class.
- » Take the **SAT/ACT** and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code **9999**.*
- » At the end of the school year, ask your high school counselor from each school you have attended to upload an official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.

GRADE 12

SENIOR YEAR: GRADUATE

- » Request your final **amateurism certification** beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your Eligibility Center account at eligibilitycenter.org.
- » Take the **SAT/ACT** again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code **9999**.*
- » Complete your final NCAA-approved **core courses** as you prepare for graduation.
- » After you graduate, ask your high school counselor to upload your final **official transcript** with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.
