

NURSE'S CORNER

January is National Blood Donor Month!

The winter is one of the most difficult seasons to collect blood, due to holidays, inclement weather, and seasonal illnesses. Typically, blood drives are hosted throughout the community as well as twice a year here at Howard High School. For additional information about school-based donation, please contact Mrs. Farriba or Mrs. Fincher. For additional information about community-based donation, please contact the America Red Cross at https://www.redcrossblood.org.

General Guidelines for Blood Donation

• Be in good general health and feeling well.

- Maintaining your iron level is an important part of being a healthy donor. We encourage you to learn more about iron and donating blood
- Be at least 17 years old in most states (16 years old with parental consent in some states).
- Weigh at least 110 lbs. Additional height and weight requirements apply for donors 18 years old and younger and all high school student donors.
- Have not donated blood in the last 56 days.

How should I prepare for my blood donation?

Please make sure to bring your photo identification or Red Cross donor card with you. You should feel well on the day of donation. If you're not feeling well, we ask that you wait and donate when you're better. Here are some other helpful tips to prepare:

- Get at least eight hours of sleep the night before your appointment
- Eat a healthy breakfast or lunch or both, if you're donating later in the day
- Choose lean proteins (lean meat, cheese and yogurt) or complex carbohydrates (bread, cereal and fruit) and avoid fatty foods
- Drink a few extra glasses of water, including an extra glass about 10 to 30 minutes before your donation
- Wear comfortable clothing with sleeves that can be raised above your elbow

It is also important that you have a good understanding of your medical history. You will be asked a series of questions that are personal in nature – about travel, medication, drug use and sex. It's important you answer questions honestly. Remember, your answers are confidential.

What should I do after my blood donation?

- Keep the strip bandage on for the next several hours; to avoid a skin rash, clean the area around the bandage with soap and water.
- Don't do any heavy lifting or vigorous exercise for the rest of the day.
- If the needle site starts to bleed, apply pressure and raise your arm straight up for 5-10 minutes or until bleeding stops.
- Call us at 1-866-236-3276 to report any additional health information that you forgot to tell us, if you have any problems or if you needed medical care after giving blood.
- If you experience dizziness or lightheadedness, stop what you're doing and sit down or lie down until you feel better; avoid performing any activity where fainting may lead to injury for at least 24 hours.
- Keep eating iron-rich foods.
- If you donate frequently, be sure to take multivitamins with iron to ensure you continue to replenish your iron stores before your next donation.







Georgia's Poet Laureate Chelsea Rathburn, in collaboration with Georgia Council for the Arts, is pleased to announce the tenth annual Poet Laureate's Prize, awarded for an original poem written by a Georgia high school student. A winner and four finalists will be selected by the Poet Laureate and announced in the spring of 2024. The winning poet and finalists will be recognized by Governor Brian P. Kemp* and the Poet Laureate in the spring. The winning and finalist poems will be published by Atlanta Magazine at atlantamagazine.com. The student authors of the winning and finalist poems will receive a signed book of poetry by the Poet Laureate. Previous winners' poems and the required entry form are available at https://gaarts.org/programs/literary-arts/poet-laureates-prize/.

Eligibility

The Poet Laureate's Prize contest is open to all Georgia high school students, grades nine through 12, currently enrolled in a Georgia public school, accredited private school, or home school. All participants must be a resident of the State of Georgia. Minors must have their parent's or legal guardian's permission to enter (see entry form for details).

Entry Guidelines

- . Only one poem per student will be accepted.
- Only original work will be considered and cannot contain previously published and/or copyrighted
 material in any part by any 3rd party.
- . The poem may not be offensive or inappropriate.
- The poem may not be longer than 36 lines and should contain no more than 250 words.
- Poems must be printed in an easy-to-read, non-italic, black font that is 12 points or larger.
- · Entrants share with Georgia Council for the Arts the rights to print and publish submitted poems.
- Entries from minors must be accompanied by a parent's or legal guardian's signature giving permission for entry.
- Entries of a poem that is inspired by or modeled after another poem should indicate that with a
 note below the title reading "after (the title of the poem, by the name of the author)." If possible,
 it would be helpful to provide a document with the text of the original poem or a link to the poem
 online.
- To be eligible, entries must be submitted with a complete entry form, including signatures. The
 entry form is available at https://gaarts.org/programs/literary-arts/poet-laureates-prize/.

- Only one poem per student will be accepted.
- Only original work will be considered and cannot contain previously published and/or copyrighted material in any part by any 3rd party.

- Poems must be printed in an easy-to-read, non-italic, black font that is 12 points or larger.




