

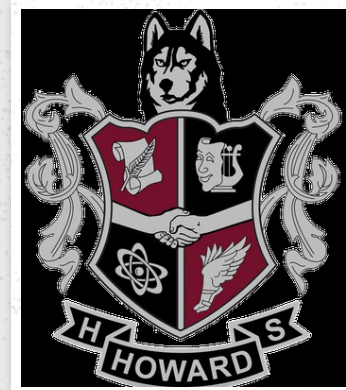

What is Tardy?

A student arriving to school after the bell, chime or buzzer has sounded



If Tardy...

What Can You Do to Help?

- Wake up early enough to get ready and arrive to school 20 minutes early to avoid long carpool lines, allow your student time to enjoy breakfast, and get ready to start their school day off right!
- Utilize District bus transportation to make sure your child arrives to school on time.
 - Set a regular bedtime schedule and morning routine.
 - Prepare clothes and book bags at night.
- Communicate any issues you may have arriving on time with school personnel.

COUNSELORS CORNER

Attendance Recovery

Students - do you have more than 5 unexcused absences in one or more of your class periods? Remember that a total of 6 or more unexcused absences in a class period results in you receiving a failing grade of 69 in that class at the end of the semester, and therefore not earning credit for the course. **Attendance Recovery is currently running each week, Monday-Thursday from 2:40 pm to 4:15 pm in Room 124.** For each afternoon you attend, 2 unexcused absences (2 class periods, NOT 2 full days) will be removed. You must attend in person; there is no option to complete Attendance Recovery virtually. Make sure you bring homework/study materials to work on during the time you attend. Don't wait until the last minute - unexcused

absences must be recovered no later than the end of the following month (example: absences earned in October MUST be made up by the end of November).

CYBERSECURITY MADE CLEAR

While the Internet can make your life easier, it can also expose you to cybersecurity threats like scams and identity theft. Here's what you need to know before you go online.

- PREPARED:** A website that sends you to their website where hackers usually collect personal information and passwords.
- SECURED:** Programs that look useful, but actually cause damage to your computer.
- PROTECTED:** Fake e-mails that appear to come from a legitimate source leading to "help" centered for their user information.
- SPYWARE:** Software that secretly watches what you do on your computer and sends the information over the Internet.
- VIOLATED:** Self-installing programs that damage hard drives and affect the normal operation of your computer.

5 Things You Can Do To Protect Yourself & Your Computer

1. Install firewall, anti-spam, and antivirus software, and update them often.
2. Don't open e-mails from unknown senders. Download software from a source you don't know or enter "your" sensitive data from a source you don't know.
3. Guard your passwords - don't share them over e-mail or instant message, and change them often.
4. Type in the website address instead of clicking on a link.
5. Look for "https" or a picture of a lock in your browser window before buying anything or opening an attachment in e-mails.

Huskies may visit the media center with a pass from teachers to check out books. Please follow these steps before visiting. Log in Classlink and click on Follett Destiny and Online Catalog. Search for books of interest as shown in Mrs. Johnson's Media Center Orientation video in ELA classes. Write down the titles or Call Numbers so that you can readily locate your books. After you have completed the steps above you may visit the media center. Upon entering the media center sanitize before going to the shelves, check out your book and sanitize as you exit.

Students may also choose to locate books on Follett Destiny and Online Catalog and complete the form by scanning the QR Code and pick up books within 24 -72hours. It may not take three days but just in case you complete the form after school hours, on a Friday, weekend or holiday, this gives us an opportunity to have your selections pulled in a timely manner.

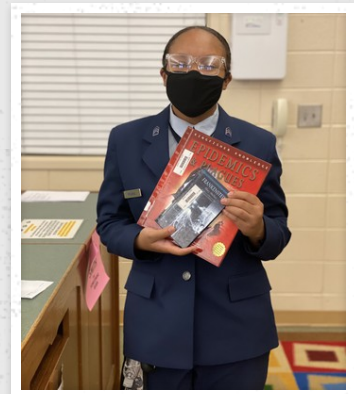
The Media Center now offers printing for student assignments only, not personal. Scan the QR code and complete the form if you need class assignments printed in black and white only.
